Kobzaring the New World

Jurij Fedynskyj presents the original torban,
kobza, and bandura to North America

Jurij Fedynskyj has spent the past fifteen years in Ukraine, researching the original bandura, kobza, and torban. From studying authentic construction, to researching archaic repertoire, to mastering traditional playing manner and technique, the initial stages of reconstruction have taken place. Now he is sharing that wealth of musical culture with the North American diaspora.

Jurij Fedynskyj will be "kobzaring" in a similar fashion as the traditional, blind kobzars would have. The kobzars were not concert artists as most bandurists today are. Fedynskyj will be presenting these three musical and cultural treasures through lecture and demonstration. He will also share his experiences in living in Ukraine as a cultural pioneer, working with ensembles such as Haydamaky, Karpatiany, Khoreya Kozatska, and Drevo; as well as creating the Poltava Kobzar Guild, and festival "Drevo Rodu Kobzarskoho."

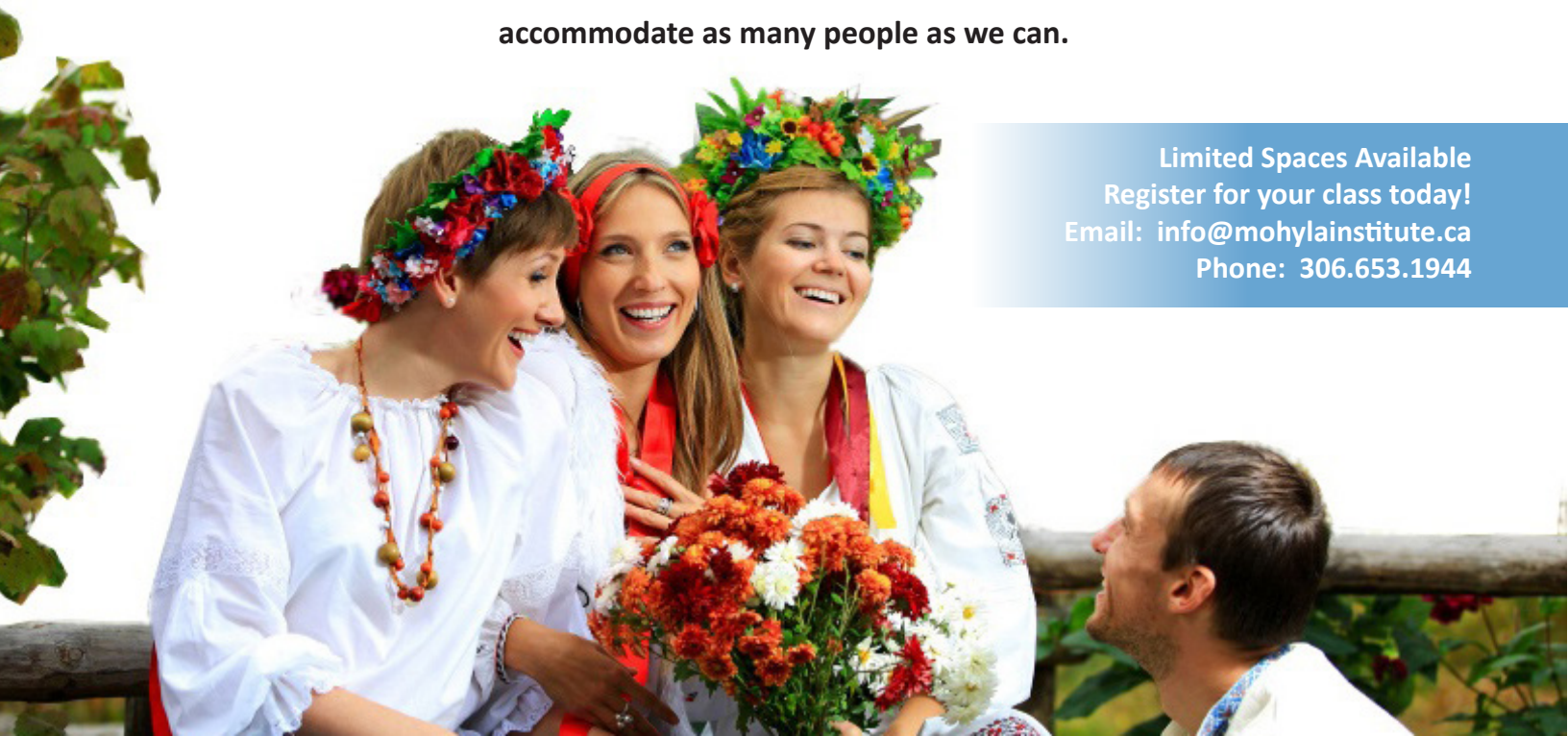
Youth Class

Ukrainian Orthodox Church of All Saints 50th Anniversary

On the occasion of its 50th anniversary, June 22-23, 2019, All Saints Ukrainian Orthodox Church (UOC) President, Evelyn Wojcichowsky extended an invitation to St. Petro Mohyla Institute (SPMI) Board Chair, Steve Senyk to bring greetings on behalf of SPMI at the anniversary luncheon which followed the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy. In her letter of invitation, Evelyn noted the important historical connection between All Saints UOC and SPMI - its first liturgical service was held in the chapel at SPMI in 1969. The newly organized All Saints UOC Congregation continued to use the Institute's chapel for liturgical services for the next eleven years. The congregation moved to its new church facility, located at 2616 Louise Street in Saskatoon, in 1980.

Mohyla Board Chair, Steve Senyk, on behalf of the board and staff, extended warm congratulations to the Congregation of All Saints UOC on the memorable celebration of its 50th anniversary. He noted that over the past fifty years an intertwined connection between All Saints UOC and Mohyla has remained steadfast. For example, approximately 40 Mohyla alumni are current members of All Saints UOC, and 14 of its 19 past church council presidents were Mohyla alumni.

In a similar vein, over the years, members of All Saints UOC were elected to serve or currently serve as members of the Mohyla board of directors. Steve also noted that All Saints UOC graciously and generously provided the use of its auditorium for Mohyla to host its 90th anniversary banquet, and again for its 100th anniversary luncheon in 2016.

In a concluding comment, Steve expressed the sentiment that the connection between Mohyla and All Saints UOC has been one of mutual benefit, a connection that is noteworthy. He said that as a community of Orthodox Christians we need to continue to find ways and means to be there for each other in the years ahead, and he ended his greeting by wishing all present - *На Мноріччя і Блаторіччя!* May God Grant you Many Years!
