More recently, four new members, namely Taras Kachkowski, Joseph Ortynsky, Wasyl Rybalka and Jordan Welbourne have been welcomed to serve on the Mohyla Board.

During the year 2014, the Board committed to engaging a representative group of Mohyla members, invited guests and the board members to develop a strategic plan for Mohyla. The strategic planning process took place on September 19<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>, 2014, in Saskatoon. The Board is taking the next steps to finalize and approve the plan.

On November 22<sup>nd</sup>, Mohyla held its 98<sup>th</sup> annual general meeting (AGM). Yes, the 98<sup>th</sup> AGM. Those who attended last year’s AGM will recall a motion directing the Board of Directors to seek certain administrative amendments to the Charter of Incorporation which was granted in 1958 to the Institute by an Act of Provincial Legislature. The original Act of Incorporation was quite specific in how the assets of Mohyla could be dispersed in the unlikely event that the Corporation should ever wind down. The Board has acted on this motion which required it to seek a private member’s amendment. Our Vice-Chair of the Board, Gerald Luciuk spearheaded this work. As of this date, the amendment has received a second reading in the fall session of the Legislative Assembly.

You will have noted in this newsletter a special appeal for donations to offset costs associated with the need to upgrade and to replace certain equipment in the food services area of the Institute to meet new building code and safety regulations. Please donate toward these required facility improvements. We need your vital support of the Institute.

More than one year has past since Euromaidan in Kyiv. As we celebrate the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ on January 7<sup>th</sup>, and the coming of the New Year 2015, let us also offer our prayers, and our moral and financial support to the men, women and children of Ukraine as they struggle to assert and maintain their independence as a free democratic nation. Humanitarian aid is needed for the thousands of Ukrainians. For more details on aid programs, visit the Canadian Ukrainian Foundation website [www.cufoundation.ca](http://www.cufoundation.ca).

As we continue our work in the new fiscal year, let us all be reminded of the need to work together with the common purpose of moving Mohyla forward. This means taking ownership and responsibility to ensure Mohyla’s future.

# Lastiwka Ukrainian Orthodox Choir and Orchestra



Lastiwka had another busy year, full of exciting activities and performances. We started 2014 with our usual carolling from house to house with New Year's Greetings and songs. We visited St. Joseph's, St. Volodymyr's, St. George's and Ilarion Senior's Residences and 22 private homes with our 'Щедрівки', and were warmly received by our hosts. We truly enjoyed the lovely reception by all of our hosts and very much appreciated the generous donations to the choir.

Plans moved quickly from caroling to Taras Shevchenko, as the choir prepared to participate in a gala concert celebrating the 200<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ukraine's most famous and beloved bard. The concert was held on February 8<sup>th</sup> at Lakeview Church, with Lastiwka, Dibrova, Spivohrai, Holosy and Holy Trinity Cathedral Choir singing and the Pavlychenko Dancers. It was a wonderful performance to a capacity audience of 700 people and the poetry of Shevchenko, in recitation and set to music, was thrilling to hear.

The spring was filled with rehearsal and the exploring of new repertoire, followed by a much needed, quiet, summer with no rehearsal or performances.

Once September began and a new season was before us, things became very busy. Lastiwka mounted 'Обжинки – A Harvest Festival' that was well received by all in attendance. Cocktails, a wonderful fall harvest meal catered by Myron and staff from Touch of Ukraine, a fun program of song and dance and great dance music by Trembita from Edmonton.

Lastiwka was invited by the Saskatoon Symphony Orchestra to do a joint performance for the SSO's Christmas show entitled 'A Ukrainian Christmas' on December 6<sup>th</sup>. The choir was delighted to accept this great invitation, and presented ninety minutes of the best Ukrainian repertoire for the season to the largest audience (1350+) the symphony has ever had for their Christmas show. Lastiwka invited Spivohrai Children's Choir and the Pavlychenko Folklorique Ensemble to present a varied program of Christmas and New Year's favorites from the choirs, and several vocal-choreographic compositions with Pavlychenko. Lastiwka was delighted to perform the

### ***What would your donation support?***

During a recent insurance inspection, it was discovered that the commercial cooking hood and fan do not meet current code. Due to this we must replace the kitchen hood, fan, and install a make-up air unit. We will be replacing the oven at the same time as it is no longer functioning properly.

This will be a major renovation for us, and a major expense. We are anticipating this project will cost \$55,000.

# Saskatchewan Ukraine Relations and the Mohyla Connections

Readers of the Institute Newsletter and e-bulletin are now familiar with the reporting of “our man in Ukraine” and Mohyla alumnus, Dr. Evan Ostryzniuk. However, many may be less familiar with other alumni who are active in nurturing and promoting relations between Ukraine and Saskatchewan. Our Province has, in fact, been a leader for many years in fostering mutually beneficial ties between organizations and individuals in Saskatchewan and Ukraine. One of the most prominent examples of current leadership in this field is the Honourable Ken Krawetz, Deputy Premier of the Province of Saskatchewan and an alumnus of the Institute.

Going back a few years, the University of Saskatchewan maintained a long-standing memorandum of cooperation with the University of Chernivtsi. Major activists in the earliest years with that initiative included Roma Franko and George Foty, both of whom were intimately involved with the Institute.

Another example of local leadership in these regional and international relations has been the Canada Ukraine Centre Inc. (CUC Inc.) operating out of Saskatoon. CUC Inc. has facilitated a series of technology transfer and academic exchanges over the years. These include MBA internships to Ukraine, symposia on academic collaboration in applied sciences and investigation of Ukrainian technical innovation. CUC Inc. has an august representation on its Board from across the three Prairie Provinces and is chaired by Boris Kishchuk, also a Mohyla alumnus and whose father was one of our early Rectors.

At a formal Government level, the Province of Saskatchewan has had long standing formal ties with the National Government of Ukraine and with regional Oblasts that began with a formal Memorandum of Understanding signed in 1995. Since that time Saskatchewan has maintained an advisory process from the Ukrainian community into government to provide recommendations on issues of mutual interest to the Province and Ukraine.

The latest mechanism for recommendations has been through the Saskatchewan Ukraine Relations Advisory Committee (SURAC) formally appointed in February, 2012 with a three year mandate. The Committee is composed of ten members and has been instrumental in providing guidance and recommendations on many issues of concern including the ‘new wave’ immigration of Ukrainians to this province, commercial and business exchanges, academic collaboration, Ukrainian language programs, and most recently the evolution of the political situation in Ukraine. Mohyla alumni are among the key leaders in this advisory group. They include Gerald Luciuk who is the Chair of SURAC and Alicia Klopoushak, Vice-Chair. Committee members MaryAnne Trischuk and James Shevchuk also have deep Mohyla alumni connections. It is gratifying to see that our Institute has been able to be such a prominent part of our province’s role in international connections with Ukraine. As the current SURAC term of office comes to an end, St. Petro Mohyla Institute strongly supports the continuation of the SURAC mandate and its role in continuing and expanding beneficial relations between Saskatchewan and Ukraine. As “our man in Ukraine” has editorialized in his earlier articles – never has there been a more pivotal moment for Ukraine’s history and, of course, for the opportunities for cooperation between our respective societies in Saskatchewan and Ukraine.

## Special Thanks

The Mohyla Institute Board of Directors and Executive Director would like to thank Terry Ludyk for his years of service. He served as a member of the Mohyla Institute Board of Directors from November 2003 to November 2014. One particular highlight of Terry Ludyk’s time with the Mohyla Board is his considerable effort put into fundraising for major roof repairs.

## Strategic Planning

The board of St. Petro Mohyla Institute organized Strategic Planning Sessions which began in the fall of 2014. We believe that a critical component of good management and governance at Mohyla is its ability to remain relevant and responsive to the needs of our community. When organizations experience dramatic change, as Mohyla is experiencing, previous goals set by the organization may not fit the current milieu, and may not be meeting the original intents of the organization.

Strategic planning can create a direction for Mohyla to maximize options in creating a renewed vision for the future, while building upon and nurturing our core assets. We envisioned the process promoting an open and creative exchange of ideas among a variety of internal and external stakeholders to generate fruitful discussion and work out potential solutions.

The internal stakeholders involved are the current Board of Directors and the Executive Director. We invited key external stakeholders from the provincial community to participate as well. At the initial Strategic Planning session, which took place on September 19<sup>th</sup> there were participants from Prince Albert, North Battleford, Saskatoon, Regina, and Yorkton.

This initial planning session began the process, and it will be continued with multiple meetings throughout the next year to finalize a working strategic plan. The facilitator who led the initial session will be back to lead discussions at key times throughout the next year.

While the primary mandate of the Institute is to serve post-secondary students, this Strategic Plan will help to build on the legacy Mohyla Institute wishes to leave. This project will draft a road map for the future direction of the Institute.

Blessing the plaque was Very Reverend Archpriest Taras Makowsky, Chaplain for SPMI, and Very Reverend Archpriest Taras Udod, Vice-Chancellor for the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada.

In September, the 1<sup>st</sup> Annual SPMI Golf Tournament took place at Holiday Park. Thankfully the weather held out this time around! We had some fantastic sponsors & participants and everyone had a wonderful time. We are looking forward to the 2<sup>nd</sup> tournament which will be held June 18<sup>th</sup> at the Willows Golf & Country Club in Saskatoon.

2014 recipient: Ashley Halko-Addley - \$200

"This scholarship is awarded to a full-time first year University of Saskatchewan student of Ukrainian descent from Saskatchewan maintaining an Honours (70% or above) average. Candidate must be living at Mohyla Institute and active in the student life of the Institute."

## **Zenon Kotelko Memorial Scholarship**

2014 recipient: Zachary Walters - \$200

"This is an open scholarship to residents of St. Petro Mohyla Institute."

"This scholarship is offered to assist academically successful students and leaders in student affairs to pursue their higher education objective."

## **Peter Shelepiuk Award**

"This scholarship was set up to encourage students to develop leadership in Ukrainian Community Work. The applicant for this scholarship should have demonstrated leadership qualities and continued interest in the future."
