National Holodomor Awareness Week 2018 November 19 – 25

National Holodomor Awareness Week takes place November 19-25, 2018 to commemorate the 85th anniversary of the Holodomor – Famine Genocide of 1932-33. Mohyla Institute will be holding a Holodomor Awareness Exhibit at Mohyla Institute. Our exhibit displays will be open to the public three days in a row from 1:00pm until 4:00pm on Tuesday, November 20th until Thursday, November 22nd. We will be playing a film by Bobby Leigh “Holodomor Ukraine’s Genocide” on Wednesday, November 21st at 7:00pm.

About the movie:

Holodomor, Ukraine’s Genocide by Bobby Leigh.

Award-winning documentary of eyewitness accounts and interviews with researchers from Ukraine and the international community, relating the latest archival information on the Holodomor.

In 1932-33, Ukraine, the breadbasket of Europe. Had bountiful crops of grain, yet its people were dying of starvation. In order to crush the will of the independent-minded Ukrainian peasants and secure collectivization of all Ukrainian lands, Joseph Stalin ordered an army of ruthless, well-fed Communist Party activists to confiscate all harvested grain and seize all the foodstuffs in the villages. As a result of this genocidal decree, by the end of 1933 nearly 25 percent of the Ukrainian population, between 7-10 million people, including 3 million children, had perished!

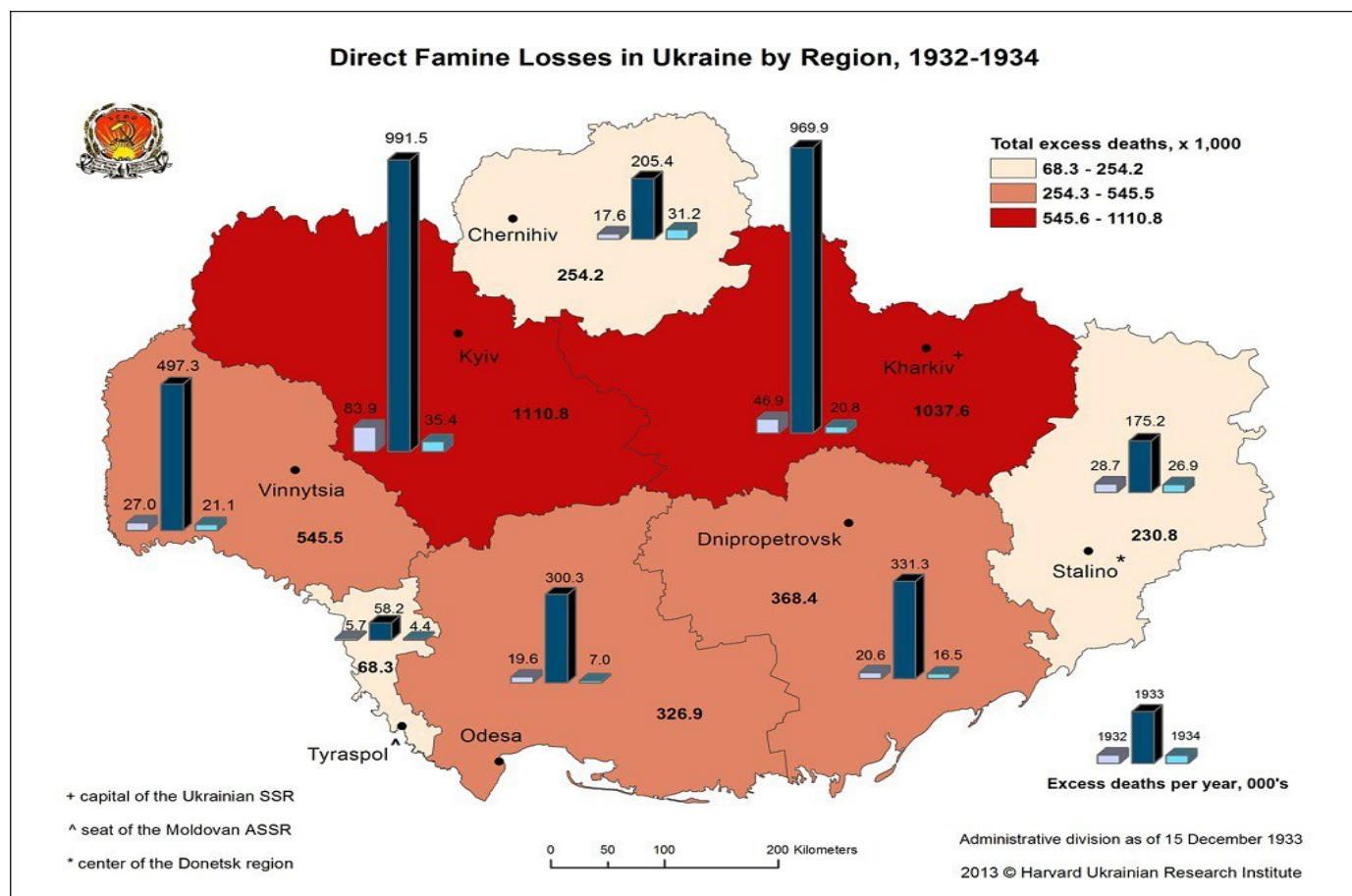

The Famine-Genocide in Ukraine, the Holodomor, was politically motivated. Current research indicates that millions perished. The Holodomor caused the death of 16-25% of the rural population of Soviet Ukraine with the highest losses not in the major grain-growing regions but in the oblasts (districts) where anti-Soviet resistance had been strongest.

2018 EXTRAORDINARY SOBOR OF THE UKRAINIAN ORTHODOX CHURCH OF CANADA

August 9-12, 2018 in Saskatoon, Saskatchewan

The first day of the 2018 Extraordinary Sobor of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church of Canada, celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Church took place at Mohyla Institute on Thursday, August 9, 2018 in Saskatoon, SK.

The Institute played an important role in the formation of the Church. It is said that the Institute was a catalyst for the formation of the Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Canada. The strong criticism of the Institute by the Ukrainian Catholic clergy finally caused some of the Institute's leaders to leave that Church in the summer of 1918. Determined not to be churchless or Godless, these leaders promptly organized a 30 person committee, which in turn organized a confidential meeting of more than a hundred people from the three Prairie Provinces that took place on July 18 & 19, 1918. There it was decided to form a Ukrainian Orthodox Brotherhood which would concern itself with the organizing of the Ukrainian Greek-Orthodox Church of Canada by calling the first Council of the Church.— Information taken from "The history of St. Petro Mohyla Institute", [compiled by Al Kachkowski](#).

It is a great way to refresh your Ukrainian language knowledge or learn the language from the scratch. Students of all ages are welcome!

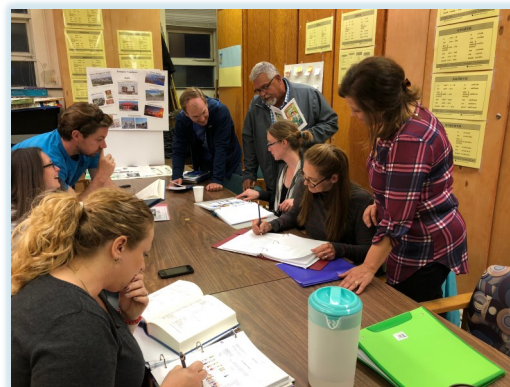
We will be offering classes based on level of demand on a first come first serve basis. Sign up today to guarantee a spot in the next round of classes!

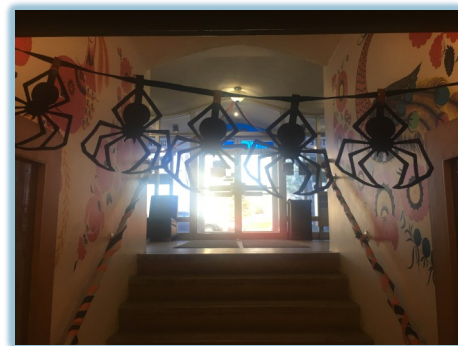
